Hello from Edmonton - I am praying for you as summer is winding down and the fall ministry season is right around the corner. May the Lord use your life and service in unique and powerful ways!

Some of our BGC pastors have transitioned to other places of service this summer. We wish

them well and look forward to seeing how God leads others to take their place. A few of these contacted me about their departure and asked for advice on how to know if it is time to make a move. Here are five aspects of decision making I shared with them. I have used these in my own decisions and I offer them to you as well.

- 1. Do I have fire in the belly? As you think about your pastorate, do you still have the passion and desire to glorify God and accomplish more in this place?
- 2. Mandate any giants left to deal with? Are there things that I am leaving for my successor that I should handle with grace and humility with before moving on?
- Spouse what does she think? God uses our spouse to bring clarity to big decisions. They often see the whole picture as to how this will affect family, marriage and their life and career.
- 4. I need friends to speak truth to me on this what do my colleagues and trusted friends say to me about this move?
- 5. Call of God do I have a clear sense of the Lord's moving me on? Am I going to something or running from something?

Depending on your response to these points, you can make a move or stay in place with confidence. Those of our BGC churches that are the most stable and fruitful have some commonalities and one of them is that there has been a long-serving lead pastor. The Lord can use you where you are or in the new opportunity. Allow your District Minister and /or I walk with you when you face this time of decision.
