Hello from Montreal - I am here with leaders from various denominations and the topic is "Evangelicalism in Canada: Past, Present and Future." Evangelicals in Canada often get branded with nicknames or outright misrepresented in the media. The recent election in Canada saw strong criticism of candidates holding evangelical positions on

abortion, assisted suicide and LGBTQ issues.

"Evangelical" as a term is under scrutiny now more than ever. Do you self-identify as evangelical? It's not always simple to define what evangelicalism is. Bebbington's well-known <u>quadrilateral</u> outlined 4 aspects of evangelicalism: The necessity of personal conversion, the centrality of the Bible, the Cross of Christ, and good works at home and around the globe. It started as a subset within Protestantism. But it has endured for three centuries and today is a growing, dynamic spiritual force in the world.

Our rich history goes back to the Moravians and the Great Awakening in the days of Whitefield, Edwards and the Wesleys. They saw themselves in continuity with the early church. The emphasis was on conversion, revival and true heartfelt religion. The movement was international and interdenominational in its roots and continues that way today. All agreed in the essential of gospel proclamation so missions became a priority. There was also social impact as evangelicals advocated the repeal of slavery, care for the poor and prison reform.

Also to know God's presence is a key aspect of evangelicalism. To have a living faith - not just assent to a creed. This produced devotion to Christ that led to sacrificial service in the darkest places on earth. We are a dynamic spiritual movement - more than doctrinal precision but centred on the "life of God in the soul of man".

However, now some Christians are asking: Should we change the name? Some authors like Scott McKnight advocate that we bury the name "evangelical".


Survey polls show that the great majority of Canadians do not approve of President Trump. However, he currently enjoys strong support by evangelicals in the US and that association affects us negatively in Canada. These US evangelicals are predominantly white, don't often attend church, but believe in God, America and have unequivocal support for Trump.

I cherish the way the gospel came to me through my evangelical roots. I do not want to give up that name because of unfavorable connections elsewhere. We have to be willing to be misunderstood for the sake of the gospel. We can't avoid censure of the world or be embarrassed to stand for fear of the culture.


The BGC has to be anchored in true Christianity. We have to choose our identification. There doesn't appear to be a good alternative name for who we are - so we face a long term project to identify ourselves to our Canadian people. Let's focus on Christlikeness in our character, works and gospel proclamation. Canada needs Jesus and we have this moment to make a difference for Him.
