Hello from Edmonton – I hope you are well and living faithfully for our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Hey – company is coming! Christmas is the peak season when unchurched or nominal attendees think of visiting a place of worship. Are you ready for company? Don't just settle for telling the story the same way but cover it with prayer, put

creative thought and Spirit-boldness into your Christmas events.

What is the reach of a pastor's influence? The world has us on the defensive – claiming that religion has no place in the public sphere. Solid research has been done on the impact of Evangelical Christianity and the ripple effect of our congregations in Canada. Secular, peer-reviewed documents on the benefit of religion in Canada have been presented to the Senate in Ottawa. The BC Humanist Association wanted advancement of religion removed as a charitable purpose. The CCCC intervened in the court case as well as others. The conclusion was that there is a tangible benefit to the public with the advancement of religion.


Churches bless Canada by proclaiming the Word of God, but also in more ways than first thought:

- Activates pro-social attitudes & behaviour. The committed churchgoer is much more likely to have more concern for social issues. Secular ethics does advocate the same things but Christianity prioritizes this.
- Better personal outcomes Religion promotes responsible life choices and improved health. Christian teaching leads to good citizens, care for others, and acting for the common good.
- Tangible community benefits Christian people serve the public and care for people. The committed churchgoer is not likely to commit crimes, overdose on drugs or stress the welfare system.
- Tangible benefits for the public at large evangelicals give to their churches but also generously support secular charities more than the average citizen.

How can we measure the socio-economic impact of churches? Have you heard of Halo Canada? Go to their website www.haloproject.ca for more stats are research on the "halo effect". Since 2016 they have studied 80 Canadian churches. Research shows that for every \$1 donated, the value to the community is \$3.68. People come to worship, then go out to eat, buy gas or groceries, etc. There are 21,249 places of worship in Canada and the stats show a \$15billion impact on local economies near the place of worship. This is helpful data for you if seeking re-zoning permits. We have to speak the language that city hall understands.

Pastors – serve the Lord with powerful purpose and Holy Spirit discernment in these days! We are praying for you in the national office and are ready to serve you and your church.
